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Module Description:

This module aims to develop digital, Industry 4.0, talent through flexible, innovative, and technology-enabled, experiential learning; bringing enterprise expertise into education, and education into the workplace to form a co-designed future learning environment. In this, the second part of the Future Focused Professional Portfolio module, learners will be expected to critically reflect on their future focused professional expertise using the t-shape professional competence development scale. Here t-shaped is considered a mid-point along a scale of letter-shaped groups, where for example, a T-shaped professional is endowed with both 'vertical' competences in specific disciplines/systems, and 'horizontal' capabilities to deal with different problematic contexts effectively addressing change" (Barile and Saviano, 2013). The module provides a structure for students to demonstrate clear links between the theoretical component of their programme and their practice; specific to their respective settings. The portfolio will comprise of a collection of diverse evidence of students' competences and capabilities in relation to future focused letter shaped professional development and will demonstrate evidence of reflection, synthesis and selection. This module is part 2 of a longer module. Part 1 will be delivered in Autumn term and is entitled FUTURE FOCUSED PROFESSIONAL PORTFOLIO 1.

Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this module the learner will be able to:

- LO1 Select examples of 'best practice' from their existing portfolio of work which demonstrates their T-Shape professional competence development.
- LO2 Demonstrate critical reflection skills in the development of the portfolio.
- LO3 Reflect critically on their key learning goals and achievements.
- **LO4** Demonstrate a commitment to reflective professional practice.
- .05 Value self-determined learning in the development of the portfolio.

Indicative Content

The programme will be delivered fully online. Students will experience a supportive and dynamic learning environment in which there will be an emphasis on peer learning, team learning, critical reflection, and feedback. Students will be facilitated in recording and reflecting on their disciplinary and transdisciplinary competence development throughout their programme. Work will be graded based on critical reflection on learner's competence development and production of their final portfolio.
